


Glenn Ivey (MD-4)

Background

A career attorney with a long history of public sector service, Ivey presents a robust platform addresses ranging from national gun licenses to Medicare for All

Began his career as a legislative assistant in the House before moving to the Justice Department as an assistant US attorney; returned to Congress as chief counsel to then-Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle (D) and worked on the Whitewater committee before being appointed as chair of the Maryland Public Service Commission in 1998

After a brief stint in private practice, Ivey worked as a state's attorney for nearly a decade; as state's attorney, Ivey created prosecutorial divisions to combat mortgage fraud and domestic violence; bolstered protections against witness intimidation

Withdrew from his first run for Congress in 2012 before the primary; returned to the private sector in 2011 and worked at law firms and as an adjunct law professor

Started his own firm, Ivey and Levetown, in 2020; has litigated cases focusing on administrative law and politics including cases involving a Secret Service prostitution scandal, environmental law and campaign finance violations, public corruption, and corporate fraud
